



Dropout Rates by 9th Grade Indicator








The Power of 9th Grade

- Attendance is one of the strongest indicators of how successful a student will be in high school.
- Students who are active in 3 activities (sports, drama, clubs, etc.) attend at a rate of 96%
- Student must attend ALL of their classes.

- Picking up a student: Please have them checkout with attendance, will be marked absent if they don't.

- If your student gets an Unexcused Slip...
 - Notification of a missed period (or more)
 - Check with attendance for the date/period or on Home Access Center (HAC)
 - If an error: student contacts the teacher
 - If it can be excused: a parent needs to call
 - Students have 2 days after the absence to fix an unexcused absence or make up the time (lunch detention/Wednesday School)
- Attendance is live on Home Access Center
- Remind messages go out daily to let parents know if their student was marked absent in a class/classes.

What are the Summer Academy to Inspire Learning (SAIL) Programs?

SAIL programs are FREE one-week summer programs hosted on the University of Oregon campus, where high school students learn about the various subjects from distinguished University of Oregon faculty members through fun social and interactive activities. SAIL offers Day and Residental Program options. The Residential Program is more competitive due to limited capacity, and a completed essay is added to the application. Students will enjoy packed day and evening activities, as well as an "Experience Eugene" evening. During the academic school year, the SAIL program provides precollege mentoring programs facilitated by UO college students. Our mentors work in local schools providing near peer connections to college resources, college planning, goal setting and career exploration.
